Our New Partner Homeowners



These four homes will house seven adults and fifteen children that have been living in unsafe, unaffordable or overcrowded conditions. We are getting close to the absolute best part of the Habitat process—when we dedicate the homes, close on the house loans, and the families finally get to move in.

We are SO blessed to have so many volunteers who helped build these homes—both our "regulars" and those who have worked off and on, or even just one day.
