We are nearing completion of our homes for this year. We're not quite there, as we still have some work to do, but once again, our goal is to have our families in their homes by Christmas. Our families are getting anxious to get moved in after a summer of hard work. Two of our families have completed their sweat equity hours, and the other two are very close. But, they'll keep working until the homes are done.

These four homes will house eight adults and seventeen children that have been living in unsafe, unaffordable or overcrowded conditions. We are getting close to the absolute best part of the Habitat process—when we dedicate the homes, close on the house loans, and the families finally get to move in.

We are blessed to have so many volunteers who helped build these homes—both our “regulars” and those who have worked off and on, or even just one day. We've had special groups and people doing community service work side by side with our future homeowners. We are thankful!



We are also thankful for those who provide the coffee breaks and lunches to our construction crew. We have a large number of individuals, churches, groups, homeowners and businesses who provide coffee and a snack in the morning for our volunteers, and provide lunch on Saturdays for them. Our construction and HomeStore volunteers greatly appreciate this.

ALL UNDER 1 ROOF! We are almost there!! We began our All Under 1 Roof campaign last November, to purchase and repair our new building. We have raised (or have pledged) 80% of the funding to pay for the costs. If you've already helped us out—thank you! Please consider donating and helping us reach our goal of \$400,000 (total cost).
