

CONSTRUCTION

- In 2015, Fremont Area Habitat for Humanity built four homes. To date, Habitat has built 75 homes, providing homeownership opportunity
- One home was bought back from a Habitat family and will be refurbished in 2016
- Groups volunteering on the construction site included:
 - Hormel
 - Catholic Heart Work Camp
 - Midland Admissions
 - Midland Advising
 - Thrivent
 - Midland football team
 - Crop Production Services
 - ADM
 - First State Bank – Shed Build
- 163 people volunteered over 6,000 hours on the construction sites





FAMILIES AND VOLUNTEERS

- 4 homeowners were selected for 2015 homes, and one for 2016 homes.
- These five families put in 1,680 hours of sweat equity in 2015.
- These five families participated in 8 different educational classes.
- 5 homeowners were selected for 2016 homes and one for 2017.
- 376 volunteers in 2015
- Total volunteer hours (Construction, HomeStore, Board, Committees, fundraisers) for 2015: over 22,000



MONEY MATTERS

- Habitat homeowners paid \$85,897 in property taxes to Dodge County
- \$69,000 was raised in personal donations
- Habitat homeowners paid \$244,600 in mortgage payments, which goes toward building homes
- A \$50,000 grant was received from Thrivent
- A \$40,000 grant was received from United Way
- Mr. Habitat 2015 raised \$22,800
- The Spaghetti Supper raised \$5,600
- Our Groundbreakers donated \$38,500 (included in personal donations above)
- All Under One Roof-we completed our capital campaign and paid off our building (some pledges still to come in)
- Fremont Area Habitat for Humanity contributed \$32,375 to Habitat for Humanity International Tithing program, building 7 homes in other countries. To date, we have provided funding for 101 homes globally



HOMESTORE

- Has contributed \$402,000 to Habitat since opening in 2011
- 213 people volunteered over 15,000 hours in the HomeStore in 2015
- Kept 269 tons out of the landfill since opening
- Contributed clothing and blankets to Low Income Ministry
- Donated personal care items to Care Corp.
- Contributed suitcases to Jefferson House
- Donated purses to Esther Circle Purse Project
- Donated shoes to First Congregational Church shoe drive
- Donated coats to Joseph's Closet
