



Flood Recovery

We are so grateful to our donors and volunteers who are helping our community through flood recovery and repair. Fremont Habitat is a member of the Greater Dodge County Long Term Recovery Group and is working with our partners to assist flood survivors. Our Flood Recovery Construction Manager works closely with the Lutheran Family Services Disaster Case Managers and United Way's Volunteer Coordinator, to assess family needs, complete home inspections, and arrange for volunteers to help with repairs. We've been working since March, helping families get their homes insulated, drywall hung, water heaters installed and many other repairs. Groups from Colorado, Texas, Missouri, Kansas (and more) and from all over the state have been coming to Fremont to work on homes. The work continues as we try to make sure families have heat for the winter and safe places to live. 
