### Families and Volunteers

- 6 homeowners were selected for 2016 homes.
- These six families put in 2046 hours of sweat equity in 2016.
- These six families participated in 11 different educational classes.
- 3 homeowners were selected for 2017 homes, with one backup family
- 496 volunteers in 2016
- Total volunteer hours (Construction, HomeStore, Board, Committees, fundraisers) for 2016: over 22,000
- Three families have paid off their loans in full
- Over 30 homeowners have volunteered with Habitat in 2016 to assist with lunches, construction, the HomeStore, or special events such as the spaghetti supper.

## **Money Matters**

- Habitat homeowners paid over \$92,000 in property taxes to Dodge County
- \$51,445 was raised in personal donations (includes Groundbreakers)
- Habitat homeowners paid \$266,915 in mortgage payments, which goes toward building homes
- A \$55,000 grant was received from Thrivent
- A \$45,000 grant was received from United Way
- Mr. Habitat 2016 raised \$25,700
- The Spaghetti Supper raised \$3,300
- Our Groundbreakers donated \$36,800 (included in personal donations above)
- All Under One Roof-we completed our capital campaign
- Fremont Area Habitat for Humanity contributed \$37,609 for a total of \$377,331 to Habitat for Humanity International Tithe program, building 8.4 homes in other countries. To date, we have provided funding for 109.2 homes globally

#### **HomeStore**

- Has contributed \$567,000 to Habitat operations since opening in 2011
- 265 people volunteered 15,168 hours in the HomeStore in 2016
- Kept over 474 tons out of the landfill since opening
- Contributed clothing and blankets to Low Income Ministry
- Donated personal care items to Care Corp.
- Contributed suitcases to Jefferson House
- Donated purses to Esther Circle Purse Project
- Donated shoes to First Congregational Church shoe drive
